



Between 2010–2015,

FIU faculty have received \$77.8 million from USAID, NSF, NIH, NASA, NIDA, NIMH, DOD, DOE and others to conduct sponsored research abroad, with top awards for projects in Tanzania, West Africa, Rwanda, Brazil and Mexico.
