The 2024 rankings include 2,152 universities from 125 countries and are the only global performance tables that assess universities against the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals across the areas of research, outreach and stewardship.

### FIU's top research and teaching centers with global impact towards the SDGs:

**Institute of Environment** — sustainable solutions, preservation of species, and protecting our planet.

**Global Forensic and Justice Center** — uniting the sciences for justice; serving government, industry, and practitioners through research, training, education and engagement with the community.

**Extreme Events Institute** — fostering more sustainable communities by helping them become less vulnerable to natural disasters.

**Wall of Wind (WoW)** — simulating extreme weather and testing future climate scenarios to analyze the

potential damage and devastation caused by hurricanes. Thanks to a generous grant by the NSF, FIU scientists are currently designing the next generation WoW, capable of generating wind speeds of up to 200 mph combined with a water basin to simulate storm surge and wave action.

Numerous other research and degree programs throughout the university, including in global sustainable tourism and the protection and preservation of cultural heritage, are also part of FIU's comprehensive efforts to promote sustainability.
