

# **INR3214: International Relations of Europe**

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## **Course Description and Purpose**

This course examines the foreign policies and current foreign affairs issues in Europe/the European Union as an international actor in global politics. As a way of introduction, the history of European international relations since the Napoleonic Wars will be surveyed. The focus of the course will be on the international relations of the individual EU member states as well as the European Union's relations to other important nations, regions and international organizations. Students will familiarize themselves with the general history of European integration, and current EU foreign policy making structures and institutions. The evolution of Europe as a coherent actor, and the tensions between individual states in the pursuit of global influence through the EU will be highlighted. Students will be assessed by three reading & concept challenges (a quiz, a midterm and a final), fourteen weekly news journal video entries, as well as several COIL (Collaborative Online International Learning) assignments in collaboration with European student counterparts at the University of Antwerp (Belgium).

# **Course Objectives**

#### Students will be able to:

- 1. Get familiarized with the basic common history of European international relations.
- 2. Gain a good understanding of the interrelationship of the EU and member states in the pursuit of foreign relations.
- 3. Become familiar with the European Union as an international actor.
- 4. Become equipped with the theoretical tools to explain Europe's relationship with other parts of the world.
- 5. Discuss topics directly related to important questions about European international relations.
- 6. Analyze current European foreign affairs dynamics and trends through a theoretical (comparative) lens.
- 7. Explain the impact of transnational issues on European international relations and EU foreign policy.
- 8. Improve their college-level research and writing skills when formulating complex arguments



## **COIL Assignments**

This is a COIL class. Participation in COIL is mandatory in order to pass this course. Our course will cooperate with University of Antwerp (UA)/ Belgium and each student enrolled in this FIU course will meet with Belgian students from UA on several assignment occasions (with rotation for the purpose of the COIL assignments). In early February, you will post an Introduce Yourself post in a separate UA-FIU COIL Canvas course shell, in mid-February post a news/movie choice post, then participate in four COIL Icebreaker meetings, and throughout March, you will complete four COIL Exchange assignments on News and Movies (for in-depth descriptions of these COIL assignments, please see below), and submit a COIL Reflection Write-up on your experience. Not only will COIL provide you a seat at the pioneering fore-front of cuttingedge international education learning methods but it will also give you the opportunity to learn from and engage with European citizens residing in Belgium—the country in which many European Union institutions as well as NATO have their headquarters.

The COIL with UA will consist of several assignments and count for a total of 53 points:

### **COIL Participation Form**

Please fill out, sign and date both pages of the COIL participation form in week 1 of this course and upload to the corresponding assignment dropbox (in "Modules"). Completion of this assignment counts 3 points.

COIL Completion of Sign-up in Separate UA-FIU COIL Canvas Course Shell

### \*\*\*This first part of the assignment is completed in our separate UA-FIU COIL Canvas\*\*\*

To enable you to cooperate with your Belgian student partners, all COIL activities will take part in a shared separate Canvas course shell. To gain access, you will be sent an invitation email to your FIU student email address the week after the Add/Drop period ends (January 24). You will need to follow instructions of this invitation and create a separate account in Canvas-Free (free of charge) with a password and make a first log-in to this UA-FIU COIL course shell. An announcement will be sent in the week of February 1 to remind you of this.

#### **COIL Introduce Yourself Post**

#### \*\*\*This second part of the assignment is completed in our separate UA-FIU COIL Canvas\*\*\*

You will introduce yourself to the UA-FIU COIL course in the separate UA-FIU COIL course shell with a video post. This assignment will open as soon as you access the separate course shell (week of February 1) with a due date of February 7, 2022. This is so because the semester in Belgium begin in February only. You will post a video to introduce yourself. This assignment will count for 5 points.

### **COIL Exchange on News & Movies Assignments (Posts & Video Uploads)**

### \*\*\*This assignment is completed in our separate UA-FIU COIL Canvas\*\*\*

COIL Exchanges (20 points; four at 5 points each): Based on the assigned partner students list on Canvas (provided in week of February 21-28, 2022), you will be interacting with a total of four different UA students in two exchange rounds after the above icebreakers throughout March. As such, the four assignments you will complete on each of those two exchange rounds will be an Exchange that is video-recorded by one of the two students in the team (UA or FIU student) and then later uploaded. You will choose two freely accessible movies/documentaries and two news articles. The choice of topics is yours alone, however, they will have to have European international relations relevance. By February 14, 2022, you will post your choice for four (two news articles and two movies/documentaries) along with their weblinks and three questions each which the UA student will be able to prepare for the eventual exchange round. That is the second active step in the UA-FIU separate Canvas course shell after the earlier Introduce Yourself Post, i.e., Pre-Exchange Posting of News Article and Movie Weblink and three questions you are planning to ask them in the Exchange about that chosen news and movie (Have, however, also additional questions ready to ask them in addition to the three you will have sent them). This preexchange post counts 10 points (one comprehensive post with two news articles and two movies/documentaries and 3 questions each for a total of 12 questions, including a weblink for each media). Part of the assignment is also that you once the student partner assignment list is available—agree on a suitable time and date that you can virtually meet with your UA counterpart on four occasions but the actual exchange and the video upload of it into the separate UA-FIU Canvas course shell is what is the second part that is graded and counts 5 points per exchange--in all 20 points (four exchanges). For scheduling purposes, be aware that for a period between March 13 (daylight saving time begins in the U.S.) and March 27 (daylight saving time begins in Belgium), the regular time difference of six hours between U.S. Eastern Time and Central European Time is shortened to just five hours time difference (with March 28, the regular time difference of six hours is restored). In general, as a student of IR of Europe, you will naturally be interested to find out more on political topics from a European viewpoint of your UA counterpart, while the UA students are in an Advanced English course and they will be interested in practicing their English skills with you, so keep that in mind. Also keep in mind that there are two exchange rounds and with each having two exchanges (for a total of four). In any case, it will be four exchanges in total but do refer to the partner assignment list to identify when you meet with which partner students. Also note that the UA student will choose whether to talk about a news or a movie/documentary that you chose, so it will be up to your partner. The first exchange round runs from March 7-17, the second exchange round is from March 21-31.

## **COIL Icebreaker Meeting Video Upload**

\*\*\*This assignment is completed in our separate UA-FIU COIL Canvas\*\*\*

This COIL activity will earn you 5 points in total. You will receive an assignment via a list shared in our UA-FIU Canvas class online in mid-/late February and you will coordinate with your four assigned University of Antwerp (UA) counterparts to meet online in two rounds: First, between February 22 and (at the latest) March 10, 2022, and, second, between February 22 and (at the latest) March 24, 2022 (refer to the COIL deadlines below). When scheduling a meeting, be aware that they are six hours ahead in terms of time zone, so 4:00pm U.S. Eastern time in Miami, Florida, means 10:00pm Central European time in Antwerp, Belgium. Somebody in the UA-FIU icebreaker duo will have to record the meeting and then later upload (please agree with your counterpart). The icebreaker task will be to engage in at least 10 minutes of conversation to introduce yourself (while your Belgian counterpart/s will do the same) via a playful activity (either (1) or (2)): (1) You may choose to introduce yourself by selecting eight nouns that you think represent yourself and then describe why each noun was selected —giving context. (2) Or, you may introduce yourself via listing your five most treasured possessions. In that scenario, you would explain why you picked each of these five and elaborate why you could not live without each of them. You will meet with four UA students in four separate meetings for this icebreaker task, so the points would be given as 1.25 points per each meeting. This assignment will count for five (5) points of your class grade. Note: \*\*\* MAKE SURE TO NAME THE UPLOADED FILE BY STUDENT LAST NAMES AND AFFILIATION IN THE FORMAT "{LastName}-FIU\_{LastName}-UA". FOR EXAMPLE: "Rodriguez-FIU\_DeBruyne-UA.mp4" \*\*\*

#### **COIL Reflection Sheet**

After each of the COIL News Exchange Rounds are completed, you will fill out a write-up COIL reflection sheet--two sheets in all. This counts 5 points (2.5 points each) and consists of answering 7 questions with 3-5 sentences each and is based on your personal COIL experience in February and March. The first Reflection Sheet is due March 20, 2022 (after the First News Exchange Round), and the second Reflection Sheet is due April 11, 2022 (after the Second News Exchange Round).

# **Weekly News Video Journal**

Keep in mind that your weekly news journal entries will likely be seen by other members of the course. Care should be

taken when determining what to post.

Each news video journal submission will count for 1 points of your overall class grade for a total of 14 points of your overall class grade. There are thirteen instances in which you may submit.

The first part of this weekly assignment is identifying and posting a weblink of a news article related to current European international relations in your personal news journal.

The second part of this assignment is recording and posting a two- to three-minute video using Canvas's built-in media recorder to your news journal. Within this two- to three-minute video, you (1) summarize in your own words the news article's content (do not read it word-by-word), (2) explain the relevance to this class or general importance of this news to Europe's IR, and (3) give your own opinion about this news.

## Items to consider when writing/recording your discussion:

- Current news: Choose a news which is not older than one (1) week from the date that it is due. After all, the fact that "news" is "new" is what makes it news.
- Reputable source: Choose a news source which is reputable. That could be anything from *The New York Times*, Washington Post, BBC News, CNN, Independent, Der Spiegel/English, The Guardian, The Telegraph, The Economist or the like. Any English-language source is acceptable—as long as it is reputable and a weblink exists for it. Choose a news source which is reputable.
- Critical thinking: there is evidence that the student has adequately analyzed, synthesized, and evaluated the news article.
- Video Content: (1) summarize in your own words the news article's content (do not read it word-by-word), (2) explain the relevance to this class or general importance of this news to European international relations, and (3) give your own opinion about this news.
- Length: your video needs to be a minimum two (2) to a maximum three (3) minutes long.
- **Guidelines:** First submit your news article's weblink, then separately submit your recorded video using Canvas's built-in media recorder.
- Late submission is subject to the deduction policy specified above under "Policies."

<sup>\*\*\*&</sup>lt;u>Lateness policy</u>: As per lateness policy specified in the syllabus, a post that is one day late incurs -0.1 points deduction; two days late -0.2 points deduction; three days late -0.3 points deduction; etc. pp.; up to nine days late -0.9 points deduction—in addition to any

point deductions necessary through regular grading. (posts 10 days late would incur the full 1 point deduction and, thus, would count as 'zero.')

## **Assessments**

There will be THREE ONLINE READING & CONCEPT CHALLENGES (with Respondus Lockdown Browser).

#### **Assessment Expectations:**

- Complete the three online reading & concept challenges (Quiz, Midterm & Final) within this course
- Relevant material for reading & concept challenges are PowerPoints, Lectures, and—first and foremost—assigned required readings. Reading which are merely recommended are not directly relevant as reading & concept challenge material—unless they have been mentioned, summarized or introduced via lectures or quests, for example (nevertheless, you do not have to read them but just know what was mentioned about them, if they came up in lectures/quests). The quiz will also contain questions on the geography of Europe (important cities, provinces, bodies of water, islands, etc.).
- The reading & concept challenges are cumulative, meaning that they cover all material previously learned, though they have a focus on the material learned after the last test.
- Reading & concept challenges will consist of multiple-choice questions.
- The assessment duration is 60 minutes for the quiz and midterm, 120 minutes for the final.
- If you access the reading & concept challenge last minute then you will not receive the full amount of time on the challenge. Therefore, it is recommended to take the reading & concept challenge the latest two hours before the deadline. Please note that the assessment will close permanently after the deadline, so starting it late is not possible.
- · Result details:
  - Students will be able to see their results after the availability period has ended (i.e. all of the questions and answers).
- The expected turn-around time for grades on online reading & concept challenges is immediately after the submission deadline.
